# A DROWNING MOTHER.

A new Taiwanese mother tries to survive the strictest postpartum tradition but soon realizes that she needs to escape it.



The term 坐月子 (zuo yue zi) or literally translated to "Sitting The Month" means to allow postpartum mom to do nothing but to "sit" (rest) recover for one month after delivery. This practice has been around for thousands of years and it is still being practiced by most Chinese.

Demi has stayed in bed for weeks due to the tradition "Zuo-Yue-Zi," in which Chinese people believe in healing women's bodies after labor and helping them produce the most nutritious milk. Some elderly women also see it as an opportunity to train women into qualified mothers.

Although Demi tries to be as cooperative as possible to please her in-laws, the weeks-long confinement and endless chicken soup push her to her limit. She desperately needs a break; however, just one misstep spirals into her worst nightmare...

## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

In Taiwan, around 40% of mothers experience postpartum depression. Studies have shown that cultural factors play a crucial role: the tradition of postpartum confinement, the power structure in the family and our arbitrary interpretation of maternity.

A Dire Strait is based on the postpartum custom "Zuo-Yue-Zi." Although might be practiced differently in every family, it concretizes the arbitrary standard of a good mother in our culture. This film is a projection of my fear of this judgmental system as an Asian woman.

I have witnessed my mother, her mother, and all other mothers in my family spend their lives struggling. My mother can't stop talking about how much she was pressured during pregnancy and after giving birth. She had to sneak food into her room, forbade from a fan or even an open window during the steamy summer. "I was having heatstroke and growing heat rash all over my body, although they think I would catch a cold as soon as I take off my sweater." My mom now laughed about it.

Chinese mothers feel obligated to prioritize family over self-care while also doing it in a "right" way that pleases elders. In order to benefit the family, the fundamental unit in our collectivist belief, women are forced to lose their uniqueness and what they want in life. They not only step into the system but also trim themselves to fit into it. Eventually, mothers see it as an achievement and continue training the next generation to suffer the same way. Many younger mothers nowadays still bear such family pressure.

It took my mom, the most talented woman I know, 30 years to find out what she wanted to do with her life other than being a mother. She privileged me with a lot more freedom and choices than she had. A Dire Strait is my shout-out for her, as well as my first statement to break this chain.



## CHRISTINE LIAO AS DEMI



Christine Liao started her artistic journey as a dancer. She began taking dance classes at 3 years old and fell in love with storytelling through movement. Her interests started expanding toward theater and acting in high school and continued to grow in college, where she performed with a theater troupe at UC Berkeley. She has since worked in various short films, independent features and web videos. Christine played Waverly Jong in Sierra Madre Playhouse's Joy Luck Club in Fall 2019. Her best known role thus far is as the restaurant cashier in the comedy sketch, The ABC Who Can't Read Chinese. You can also find her in Fine China on HBO platforms and the video game Life is Strange: True Colors.

#### LEE CHEN AS MOTHER-IN-LAW

Lee Chen was born as Li Hui on February 17, 1963 in Hohhot, Inner Mongolia of China. She got her BA in English Language and later came to the U.S. to earn a MA in Education and a MFA in Theatre. She had been in many theatre and dance productions in Chicago, Honolulu and Los Angeles but then left acting for nine years to raise her two sons. She came back to act in film/TV in 2011, since then, she has guest starred and co-starred in TV shows Good Trouble, VEEP, The Morning Show, Gentefied, Arrested Development, Girl Meets World, NCIS: Los Angeles and TNT's "Southland". You can also find her in independent features including We Broke Up, DOE, Midlife and Love Arcadia.





## JASON WANG AS FATHER-IN-LAW



Graduated from the Law school of Beijing Open University, Jason later immigrated to the US in 1994 and now is a well-known producer/director of events and concerts among Chinese community in LA. He has directed more than 100 shows, including US Chinese-American New Year Festival Gala, China's Tenor Trio World Circuit, and Los Angeles Chinese Culture Festival.

His acting works including theater plays After Divorce, Love therapist, Crazy Theater, as well as feature and short films Beneath the Banyan Tree, The Monkey King, Still Rolling, Stephanie, One Face Mask, and more.

# WILLIS CHUNG AS HUSBAND

Willis Chung was born in Monterey Park, California. He is an executive producer of Mad Minds Entertainment with experience producing for brands such as Apple, Samsung and Lenovo. Parallel to his production background, Chung established himself as an entrepreneur in the digital imaging technology space, with his company Sclera Digital - clients including Marvel and HBO. Other than these roles, his passion in acting had also led him to take parts in plenty short films and TV. #### WRITER/DIRECTOR: LIANG-CHUN LIN



Liang-Chun was born and raised in Taiwan. She earned her BA of Radio and Television from Chengchi University in Taipei and MFA in Film Production from Chapman University, with directing discipline. Her previous short films, YUTAS (2013) and HIS PERFECT DEAD EX (2018), were nominated as Best Student Short and Best Narrative Short in The Golden Harvest Film Festival (biggest short fest in Taiwan). STILL ROLLING, which was selected by 2021 Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival, San Diego International Film Festival, has earned tremendous feedbacks from female audience.

Liang-Chun has directed 10 narrative short films and now continues creating content that reflects on Asian women experience. She is currently in development on GRANDMAS' BIKINI, a new feature film focuses on the identity crisis and self-recognition of elderly women, as well as ANNOYING PALACE, a comedy that discusses modern issues with tropes and cliché of ancient Chinese costume drama.


#### DIRECTOR OF PHOTOGRAPHY: BRANDON NG

#### SOUND DESIGNER: KEVIN KHOR

Horror, romance, comedy, action, sci-fi, and fantasy are just a few genre Chang is experienced in. In addition to composing epic, orchestral, electronic, emotional, and ambient music, he also loves trying out new things and adding folk, ethnic, avantgarde elements into his composition.

As a previous audio engineer who has abundant training in sound mixing and design, Chang is especially skilled at creating music that blends well with ambience and sound effects.

Graduated from the Screen Scoring Master Program at New York University, Chang now collaborate regularly with young artists across Asia and the States.

#### HAIR MAKE-UP/SPECIAL EFFECT: POTHMOLITA "APPLE" DOU



Pothmolita Dou, better known as Apple, is an international makeup artist and the first Cambodian special effects makeup artist to work in the Hollywood film industry. Apple was a recipient of the prestigious Vi Neill Makeup Artist Scholarship in 2016. With this scholarship, she attended Cinema Makeup School in Los Angeles, California, where she earned a diploma of Beauty & Special Effects Makeup.

She took training from established Hollywood artists such as Ken Diaz, Vi Neill, Leonard Engelman, Don Lanning, and Michael Spatola, and she has worked on movies, commercials, music videos and photoshoots throughout Asia and the United States. Her feature projects include First They Killed My Father, Hex, Before the Fall, The Forest Whispers, Lisa and Liza.

Apple hopes to inspire and empower future generations of Cambodian makeup artists to pursue the same career path and take it to higher levels.


